Core Basic Training: \$200.00

A Washington State Aging and Long-Term Support Administration (ALTSA); Department of Social and Health Services (DSHS) course:

Required by any Long Term Care (LTC) Worker providing care to clients in a Boarding Home (Assisted Living), Adult Family Home, Group Home or (in certain cases) in a Home Health setting. This course applies to Long Term Care (LTC) Workers in employment (in above mentioned facilities), who have not previously taken Revised Fundamentals of Caregiving Training. Core Basic Training is part of the 75 hours of LTC Worker Training required by Initiative 1163, adopted as of 01-07-12.

Core Basic Training is NOT for RN's, LPN's or Certified Nursing Assistants (NA-C's); or those who have completed those courses of study. These Certified Caregivers are not subject to taking CBT, due to the Training that they have already received.

Important Information regarding Training Regulations / classes at this time:

The New Training requirements of Initiative 1163, which were brought to and passed by the voters in Nov., 2011, by the primary initiator of I-1029, Service Employees International Union (SEIU), are now in effect, as of 01-07-12. Go to: www.dshs.wa.gov/altsa/long-term-care-professionals-providers

I-1163 Training Requirements will NOT effect RN's, LPN's or NA-C's; except ... All LTC Workers (Long Term Care Worker) must take 12 Hours of Continuing Education (C.E.) per year. The C.E. requirement must be completed by ones Birthday (not the last day of the calendar year, December 31st, as in the past). This requirement began on 07-01-12. Birthday to Birthday is the LTC Worker's "year".

Since 07-01-12, 12 Hours of C.E. must be completed by one's Birthday, or one cannot work until it IS done. See "Continuing Education Requirements" at this link:

CPR / First Aid may now be used to count for 3 Hours of C.E. A number of restrictions apply. See: www.dshs.wa.gov/altsa/training/applying-cprfirst-aid-training-hours-ce

Any LTC Worker hired as of 01-07-12 or later, must take 75 Hours of Long Term Care Worker Training (made up of Core Basic Training, Population Specific Training, Orientation Training and Safety Training). Quality Assurance Consulting, LLC, is offering these DSHS, or DSHS Approved courses:

Core Basic Training: 40 Hours

Population Specific Training: 30 Hours (or 32 Hours)

Dementia Specialty Training (LTC Worker & Manager): 8 Hours;

Mental Health Specialty Training (LTC Worker & Manager): 8 Hours;

Developmental Disabilities Training - Part 1: 8 Hours;

Developmental Disabilities Training - Part 2: 8 Hours;

Care of the Geriatric Resident Training: 6 Hours

Courses NOT INCLUDED in the 75 Hours of LTC Worker Training; but still probable Training requirements:

Nurse Delegation for Nursing Assistants Training; 9 Hours

Nurse Delegation; Special Focus on Diabetes Training: 3 Hours

CPR Training: 2 Hours

First Aid Training: 2 Hours

HIV/AIDS Training (also included in CBT): 1.5 Hours

Continuing Education: online only; Sometime in 2018 (maybe). ALL C.E. offerings are approved by DSHS. See: www.assurance - guality.com/ceu.html

As of 01-07-12: There is no more "28 Hour Revised Fundamentals of Caregiving" Training. As of 01-07-12: There is no more "Self-Study Modified Fundamentals of Caregiving" Training for NA-C's, LPN's or RN's. LTC Workers would take Core Basic Training; and RN's, LPN's and NA-C's would <u>not</u> take MFOC (as it no longer exists).

RN's, LPN's, NA-C's and LTC Workers would still need to take Dementia Specialty Training; and / or Mental Health Specialty Training; and / or Developmental Disabilities Specialty Training, if interacting with those client categories.

NA-C's and LTC Workers would still have to take Nurse Delegation for Nursing Assistants Training if needing to be Nurse (RN) Delegated for certain tasks (including passing medications).

NA-C's and LTC Workers would also still need to take Nurse Delegation; Special Focus on Diabetes Training if needing to be Nurse (RN) Delegated to administer Insulin Injections to clients.

Active NA-C (Nursing Assistant-Certified) licenses (for NA-C's);

Active NA-R (Nursing Assistant-Registered) licenses (for those eligible to have them); or

Active HM-C (Home Care Aide-Certified) licenses (for LTC Workers) are required, for Nurse Delegation to be able to occur.
